Accelerating Comprehension for Underserved Communities

Along with the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT), we are developing groundbreaking research that supports students from low socioeconomic backgrounds in building essential skills to address unfinished learning post-pandemic.



Neuroscience Drives Early Detection App for Learning Differences

Working in partnership with research institutes at Florida State University (FSU) and the University of California, San Francisco (UCSF), we have provided the testing and development of the Advanced Screener for Early Detection of Learning Issues.



Working with State Departments of Education

We are building awareness and influencing policy changes to support students with learning differences and advocating for the use of Learning Ally solutions in all classrooms across the United States. We are currently working with the State Departments of Education in Texas, Florida, North Carolina, Massachusetts, New Jersey, and California.



Introducing Brain-Based Literacy Instruction

Launched earlier this year, our new award-winning professional learning solution is unique in the market. It combines training on the science of reading through a combination of live or on-demand workshop sessions and collaborative Communities of Practice that provide opportunities to refine what was taught. Individual coaching is also available and gives educators the understanding, tools, and practice needed to apply the science of reading and close the literacy gap.


