





Step 3: Prepare

After you finish the book you can write about what you learned. Use the KWL chart to prepare before you read. In the Know column, write or draw what you already KNOW about the book. In the next column write or draw what you WANT to know. When you are done with the book come back to this chart and write or draw what you LEARNED.
