Learning Ally Audiobook Solution Educator Portal Roles

There are four roles within Learning Ally's educator portal that are essential to the successful implementation of Learning Ally in your school. Based on the role assigned, educators will have different responsibilities and access within the solution.

MASTER ADMINISTRATOR TIP: There may be more than one Master Administrator, but we recommend limiting this role to only those who should be able to see all educators and students across the school.
