# Learning Ally Audiobook Solution Educator Portal Roles

There are five Educator Portal roles that are essential to the successful implementation of the Learning Ally Audiobook Solution in your school. Based on the role assigned, educators will have different responsibilities and access within the solution.

MASTER ADMINISTRATOR TIP: There may be more than one Master Administrator, but we recommend limiting this role to only those who should be able to see all educators and students across the school. INSTRUCTOR	Uses the Learning Ally Audiobook Solution to ensure eligible students receive equitable access to grade-level content by determining student eligibility, creating students, adding books, & monitoring student reading progress.	General Educator, Special Educator, Reading Specialist, Speech/ Language Pathologist, Teacher of the Visually Impaired
READ-ONLY INSTRUCTOR	Uses the Learning Ally Audiobook Solution to ensure eligible students receive equitable access to grade-level content by adding students to their Dashboard, adding books, and monitoring student reading progress.	General educators, Para- professionals, any other educator who only needs to assign audiobooks and monitor student reading progress

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
