## **The Lion, The Witch and The Wardrobe**

Book Setting Virtual Field Trip

Grades 5-12

Authors take careful consideration in choosing where (and when) to make their story or novel take place, and the most successful authors make you even want to visit these places! Now is where you can take part in the fun by having your own book setting virtual field trip!

### **Steps:**

1. Read *The Lion, The Witch And The Wardrobe*. The book takes place in the vividly described setting of Narnia.
2. As you are reading jot down notes on the setting. Be sure to include the physical location, the time period and even details on the weather.
3. Plan your book setting field trip! Choose the option that fits how you best would like to visit Narnia.
  - o **Social Media "Photo Album"** Imagine you are the main character of the story. What would their social media photo album look like as they visited Narnia? Think of captions, hashtags, and even other characters that might comment. Organize this photo album in a virtual slide sharing tool (or it works just as well on non-virtual paper).
  - o **Live on the Scene:** You have just been sent, "on the scene" as a reporter to visit Narnia. As you are reporting out, think of what you would see happening in the background, who you would interview, and how the time period and weather might impact your interview.
  - o **Commercial:** Record a commercial inviting visitors to come to Narnia. What will they see when they get there? Where should they visit first? How much does it cost to visit Narnia? Design your own virtual backdrop or even find an image from the internet that matches Narnia.

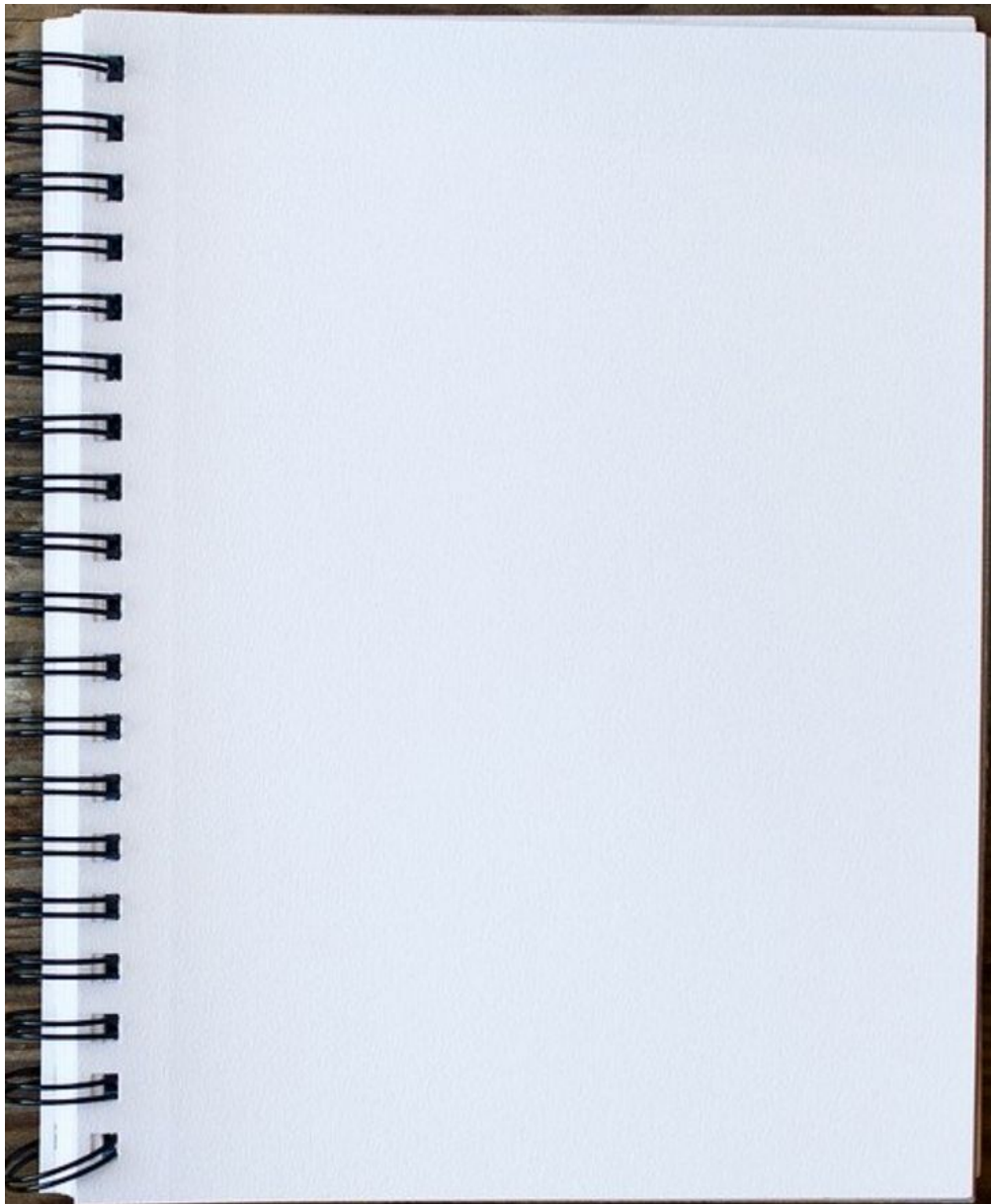
